PARTICIPATING in special ceremonies at the Museum of Modern Art, New York City, celebrating the passage of the new modern art import bill, was Miss Dorothy Dudley, registrar of the museum and daughter of Mrs. Grace Dudley, South street, Biddeford. Miss Dudley was active in the formation of the national committee to liberalize the tariff laws for art, organized last spring, and promoted the distribution of 70,000 leaflets by the committee to citizens urging them to write their congressmen in support of the tariff bill. Miss Dudley was called to Wash-

ington, D. C., to testify before the Senate Finance Committee on behalf of the proposed legislation and the bill became effective as a public law this fall. Under the new provisions, all works of art are permitted free entry including abstract sculpture, original mosaics and collages. A copy of the new art import bill and the pen used by President Eisenhower to sign the bill, mounted together on a plaque, were presented to the registrar.
